Dorothy Birmingham

August 15th, 1936 – August 10th, 2018

Honorary President Dorothy “Dottie” Birmingham was an amazing woman much loved by her family and friends. She was a 30 year member of the Maennerchor who, once committed to an organization, gave 150% of herself. She served as treasurer, recording secretary, vice president and president. Obviously her intent of “only” singing did not pan out.

She had the distinction of being the Maennerchor’s first woman president and spearheaded the purchase of the adjacent property which became our parking lot. Among many other things she co-chaired the 2003 Saengerfest hosted by the Maennerchor and was instrumental in revising our by-laws to bring them into the 20th century. She also served as Co-chair of the New York State Saengerbund Bundes Music Committee and assisted the NYSSB President, Herman Koelmel, when he was in need of someone with extraordinary organizational skills.

Dottie had a great love of the outdoors and for many years was a member of the Trail Sweepers Ski Club. In fact I first met Dottie on a hike at Tuckerman Ravine before she became involved with the Maennerchor. Her love of travel took her to such places as Russia (a notable cruise on the Volga River which culminated with us “surviving” the one and only air controller strike in Russia’s history!) , the Amazon River in Brazil and off to the north to see the Northern Lights.

We at the Maennerchor were so fortunate to have been part of Dottie’s life.

When Foursquare Co-Founder Denis Crowley created the local soccer team Stockade FC in 2015 Ryan Suto formed the Dutch Guard Supporters Group to cheer on the team. Near the end of the first season, the Dutch Guard became the leading group in supporting the team and showing numbers at away games. Toward the end of the second season, Marian Elflein became more affiliated with the group. An avid fan, he traveled to several away games with the group to support the team away from home as well as watching almost every single home game to date. In early May, at the beginning of the 2018 season he started getting very involved in the internal workings of the group

In his spare time, he started writing chants and worked at keeping the team’s official Wikipedia page updated. When this year’s season came to a conclusion, Marian was already very involved in internal discussions with most active members and the de-facto leaders of the group.

On the 4th of August, the group invited all supporters and fans that were interested to a meeting with the goal to transform the DGSG to a fully incorporated non-profit. At the get-together, the group discussed bylaws and voted on the different offices that the social club would need. It was then, that Marian was elected president. Although, the Dutch Guard is not an official non-profit yet, the board is keeping everything as professional as necessary. Marian took on the position with the intention of leading the group into the next big chapter of establishing it as a legally recognized non-profit within the next year or two. The second big project for him will be creating merchandise for sale to enable the group to purchase new materials for choreographies, banners, drums, and flags.
