*“Stammtisch” after Five Years – a Resumé, by Michael Scheunemann*

Here we are, in spring 2019, my daughter is eight years and the “Stammtisch” is five years old!

Both facts show me how relative time and our perception of its passing are, a phenomenon that we often summarize with: *“Unbelievable, how fast time is passing by?!”* Like raising a child, an institution needs a regular schedule, clear rules, persistency, perseverance and at times patience and always passion.

During the years, a few things at the Stammtisch have changed. Among these the written and printed agenda and the formal attendance list, to name a couple, but then, neither do I take as many pictures of my daughter as I used to. That means that an established routine requires sometimes fewer formal procedures. And the Stammtisch is informal, providing a family-like atmosphere and trustworthiness, talking to and among respectful friends, which is perceived as a real pleasure and delight by all attendees.

However, the pivotal pillars of persistency, passion, perseverance have not changed: We are still meeting every other Thursday, mostly from 5:30 p.m. - 7:00 p.m., of course with the exception of weather-impeded days and of an approximately two months long summer pause. We still have only a couple of very clear rules, which are: mutual respect and using German as a language of communication.

The latter comes with the exception of a few occasional words of “sprinkled” English that will be translated into German and often serve as opportunities to enhance the idiomatic vocabulary in both languages of all the attendees. We are passionately talking about topics that are close to our hearts, the range is very broad and covers many individual personal and culinary issues but also recent German cultural and societal developments to keep informed about “our” country and culture of origin. And yes, we do so with the help of a lot of good and comforting food!

Regularly, we are privileged to listen to the literary gems of our regular attendee, Professor (emerita), Dr. Edith Borchardt, who has been reading her own German short stories to us with titles such as “Gypsy Girl”, “Der weiße Skarabäus,” [“The White Scarab”], and “Reisen auf der Prairie,” [“Travels on the Prairie,”] to name just a few. These intriguing and fascinating stories often serve as vehicles to enhance our conversations on all sorts of topics and have been published during the past year.

As an established institution at the Maenner- and Damenchor, the Stammtisch serves as an additional offering for members to keep their German language and cultural heritage alive by conversing on a regular basis in German in an atmosphere of trust and respect, under the guidance of a native German language teacher. As one attendee put it recently: *“The Stammtisch provides regular German conversation with spiritual and emotional nourishment.”*

The next meetings of the Stammtisch will be: *May 9<sup>th</sup>, May 23<sup>rd</sup>, June 6<sup>th</sup>, June 20<sup>th</sup>, Aug 22<sup>nd</sup>, Sept. 5<sup>th</sup>, Sept. 19<sup>th</sup> Oct. 3<sup>rd</sup>, Oct. 17<sup>th</sup>, Oct. 31<sup>st</sup>, Nov. 14<sup>th</sup>.*
