

From the Archives

During a visit to the recently opened Brickmen restaurant in uptown Kingston, I couldn't help but notice the unique brick decor and large historic photos of the Rondout brick industry decorating the walls. I learned that the owners grandfather was an iconic figure and union organizer in the local brick business. This was a thriving business after a great fire in 1835 in NYC destroyed 13 acres of wooden buildings and new regulations stated that they be made of brick and stone. Many German and Irish immigrants as well as other's were employed at the more than 65 manufacturing facilities in Ulster County alone including the famed Hutton Brick Co. They produced millions of bricks which constructed much of New York city's infrastructure such as the Empire State Building and the arches of the Brooklyn Bridge. With other industries being replaced during the collapse of the Rondout area such as coal, cement, blue stone and natural ice, the brick industry held on from the 1800s to the last brick being produced in 1979. Guess they loved to play with the clay.
